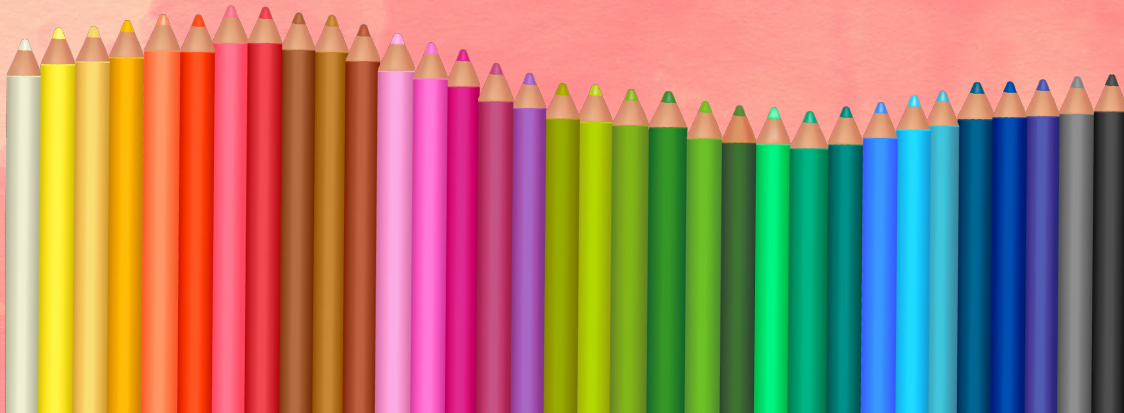
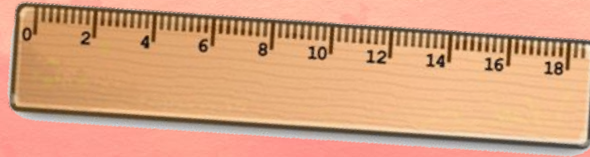
Project Overview

- Students will create a linear perspective drawing using one-point perspective drawing to create the illusion of depth and space in their drawing. Students will draw a street with buildings.



What You Will Need:

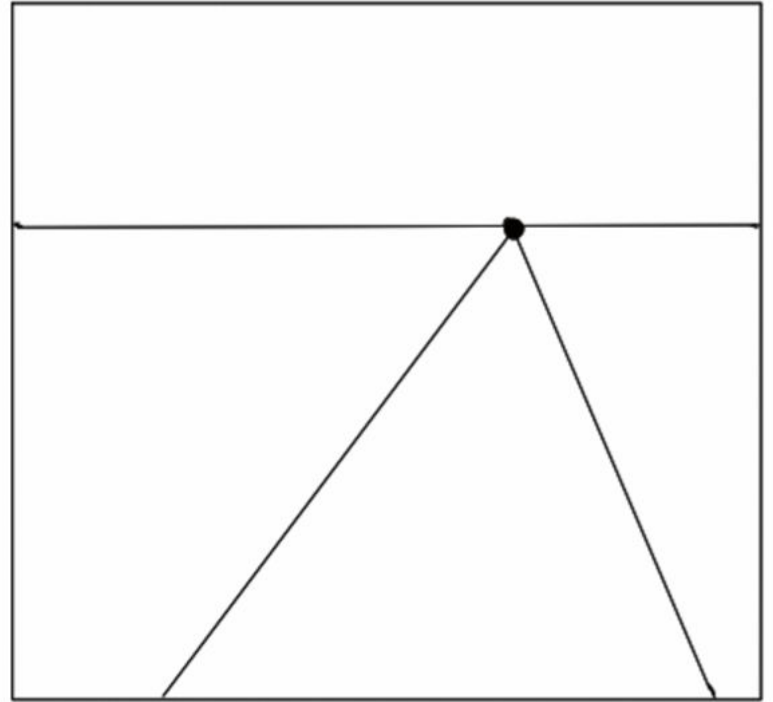
- Pencil
- Eraser
- Ruler
- Variety of colouring mediums (Colouring pencils, Markers, etc.)
-Optional
- Quality Drawing paper (Blank paper is fine)



Practice/Rough Copy

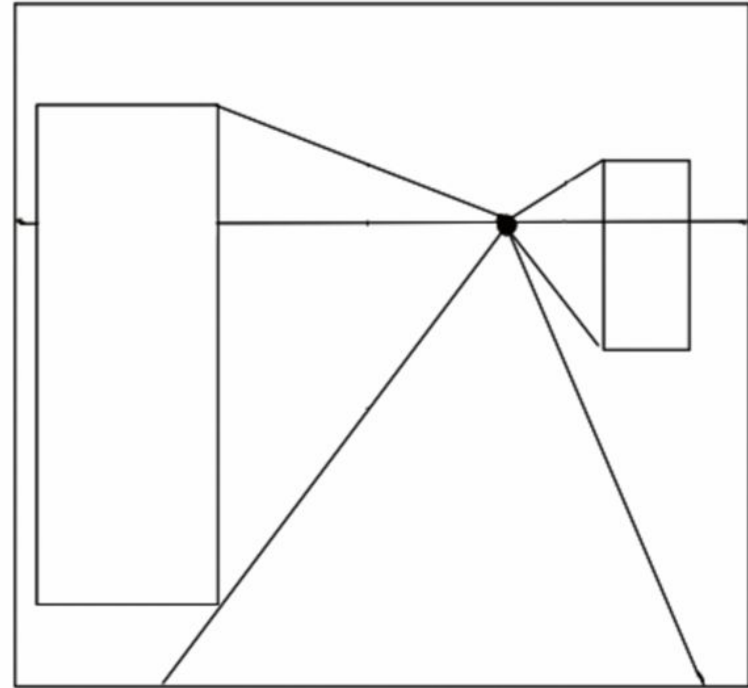


Step 1



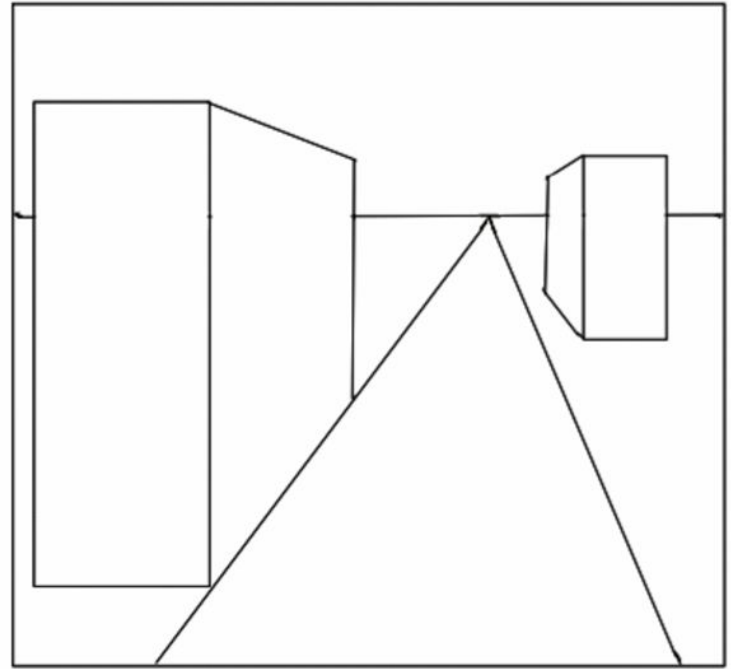
1) Draw your horizon line (line across your page) and your vanishing point (dot on horizon line). From the vanishing point, draw two lines.

Step 2



2) Draw your first building(s) by drawing a rectangle. Draw a line from the top corner and bottom corner to the vanishing point on your horizon line.

Step 3



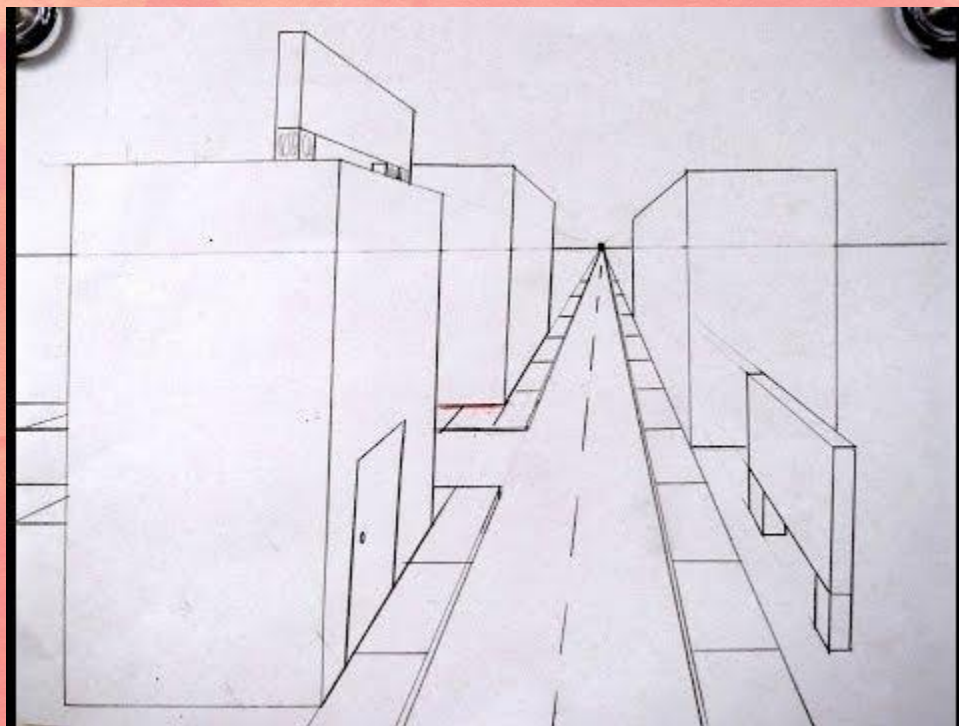
3) Add a second wall line and then erase any extra lines that extend to the vanishing point to complete the basic shapes of your buildings. This wall will be parallel to the front edge of your original rectangle.

Step 4

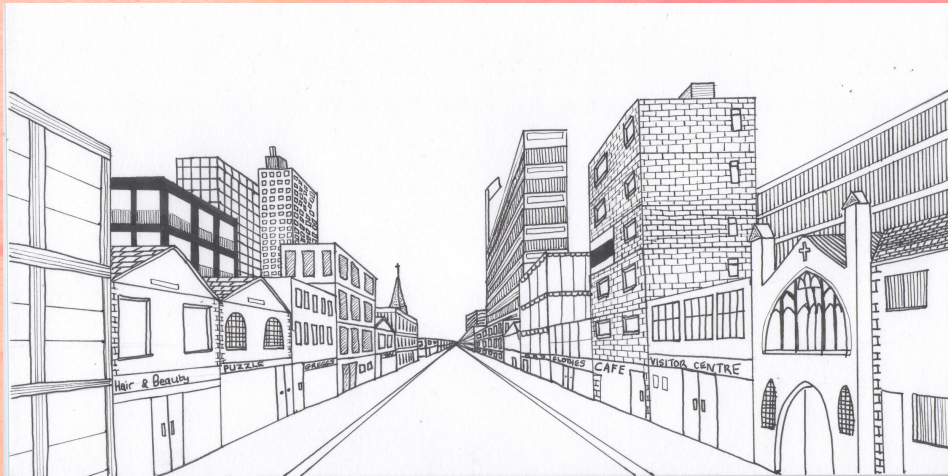


4) Add details to your foreground, middle ground, and background. Objects closer to the front will be larger, and as they move toward the background, they will become smaller.
