# Two-Point Perspective

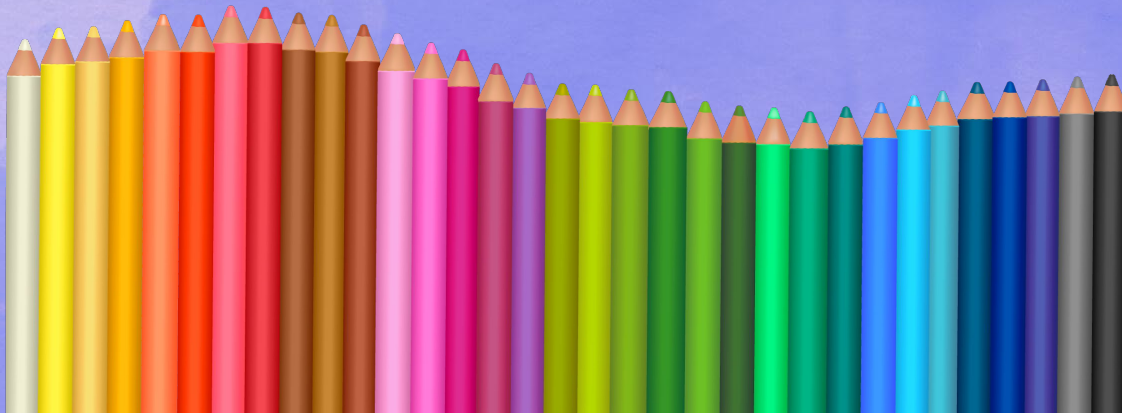
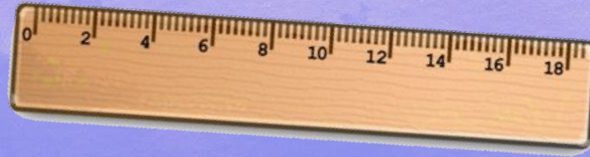
Now that we have had some practice on “Two-Point Perspective” drawing, we will move on to our Two-Point Perspective Project.

- Quality Drawing paper (Blank paper is fine)

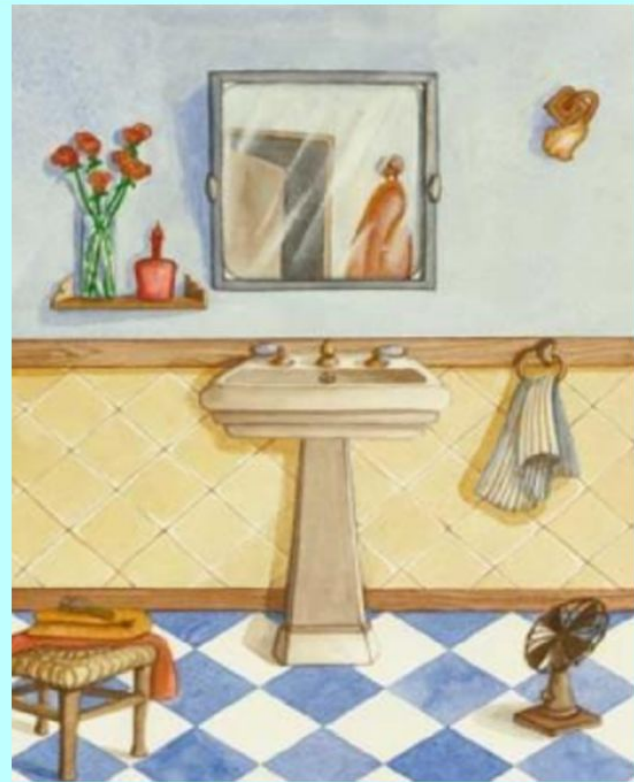


# ROOM DESIGN ASSIGNMENT



# SPECIFIC EXPECTATIONS:

- CREATE A DRAWING OF A LIVED-IN ROOM (LIVING ROOM, "MAN-CAVE," BEDROOM, KITCHEN, BATHROOM, OR OTHER)
- MAKE SURE YOUR DESIGN SHOWS PERSPECTIVE! CHOOSE A VANISHING POINT AND DRAW AT LEAST THREE OBJECTS DEMONSTRATING 3-DIMENSIONAL PERSPECTIVE
- THIS PROJECT SHOULD BE IN COLOUR - SO USE YOUR PENCIL CRAYONS.



## MAKE SURE:

\*YOUR IMAGE FILLS SCOPE OF THE PAGE

\*THE OBJECTS ARE TO SCALE (A CHAIR IS NOT SIGNIFICANTLY SMALLER THAN A TABLE, FOR EXAMPLE)

\*THAT THE COLOUR SCHEME IS WELL-THOUGHT OUT (AND COLOURS ARE MIXED AND IN ONE DIRECTION)

\*THAT THE PICTURE IS WELL-PLANNED OUT (THROUGH A ROUGH COPY) AND CREATIVE.

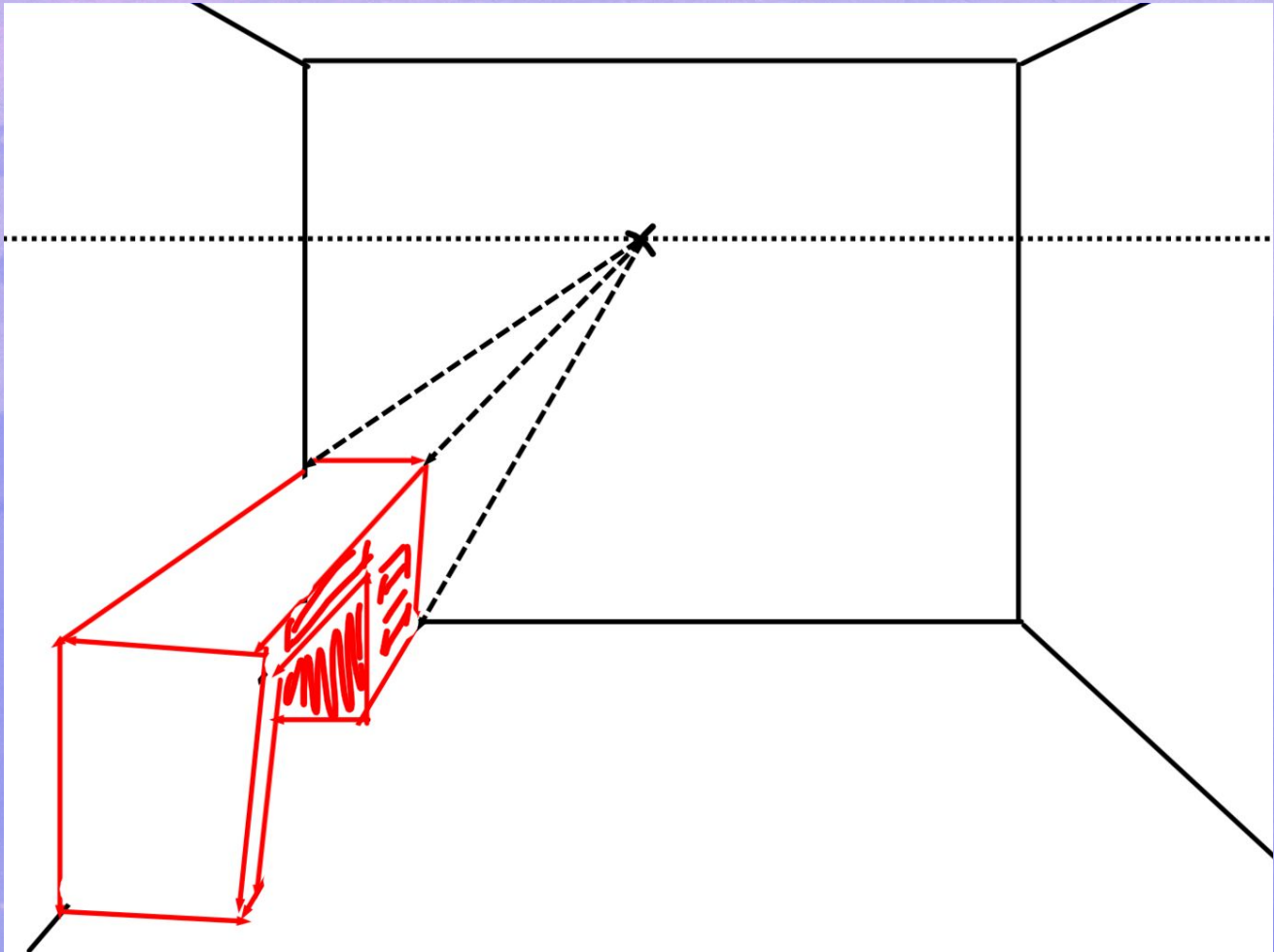


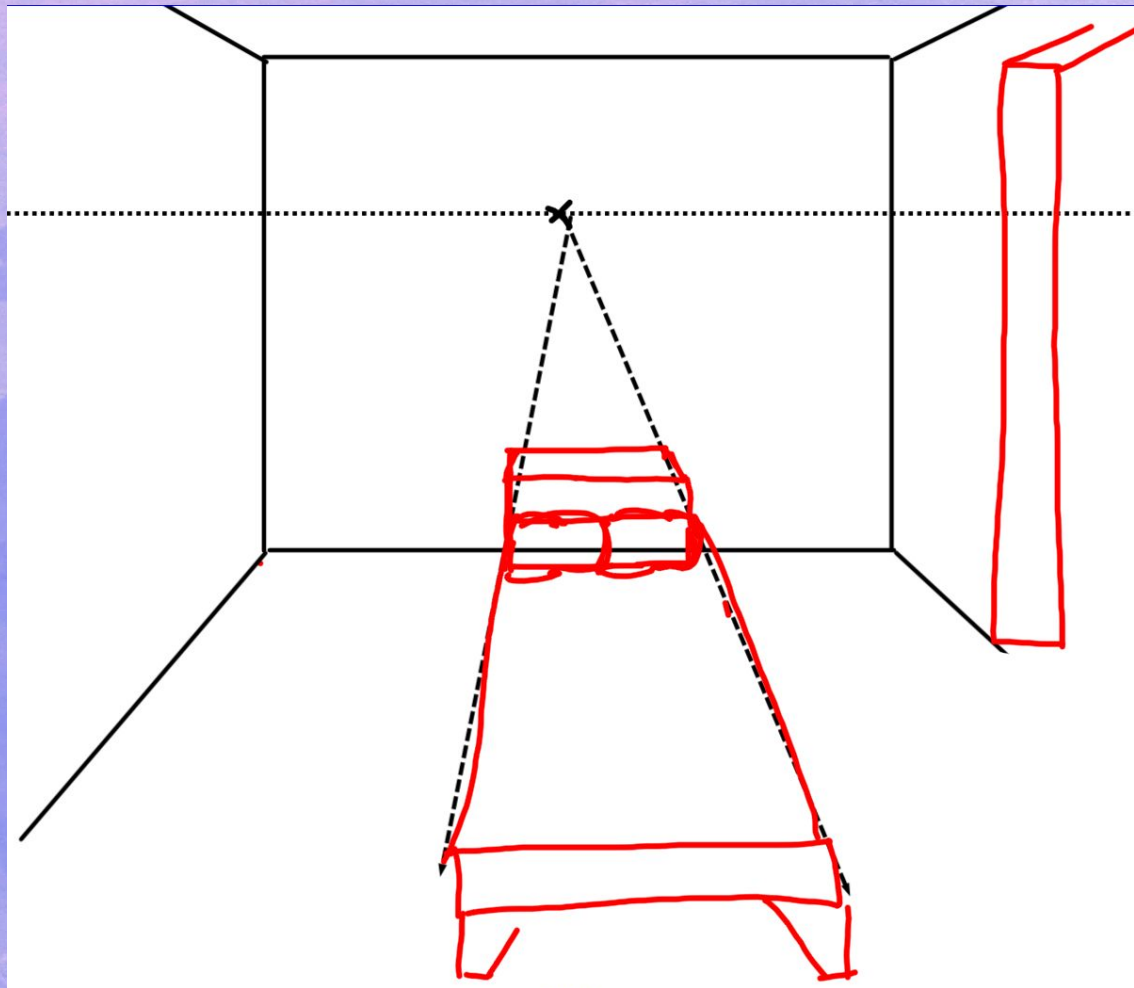


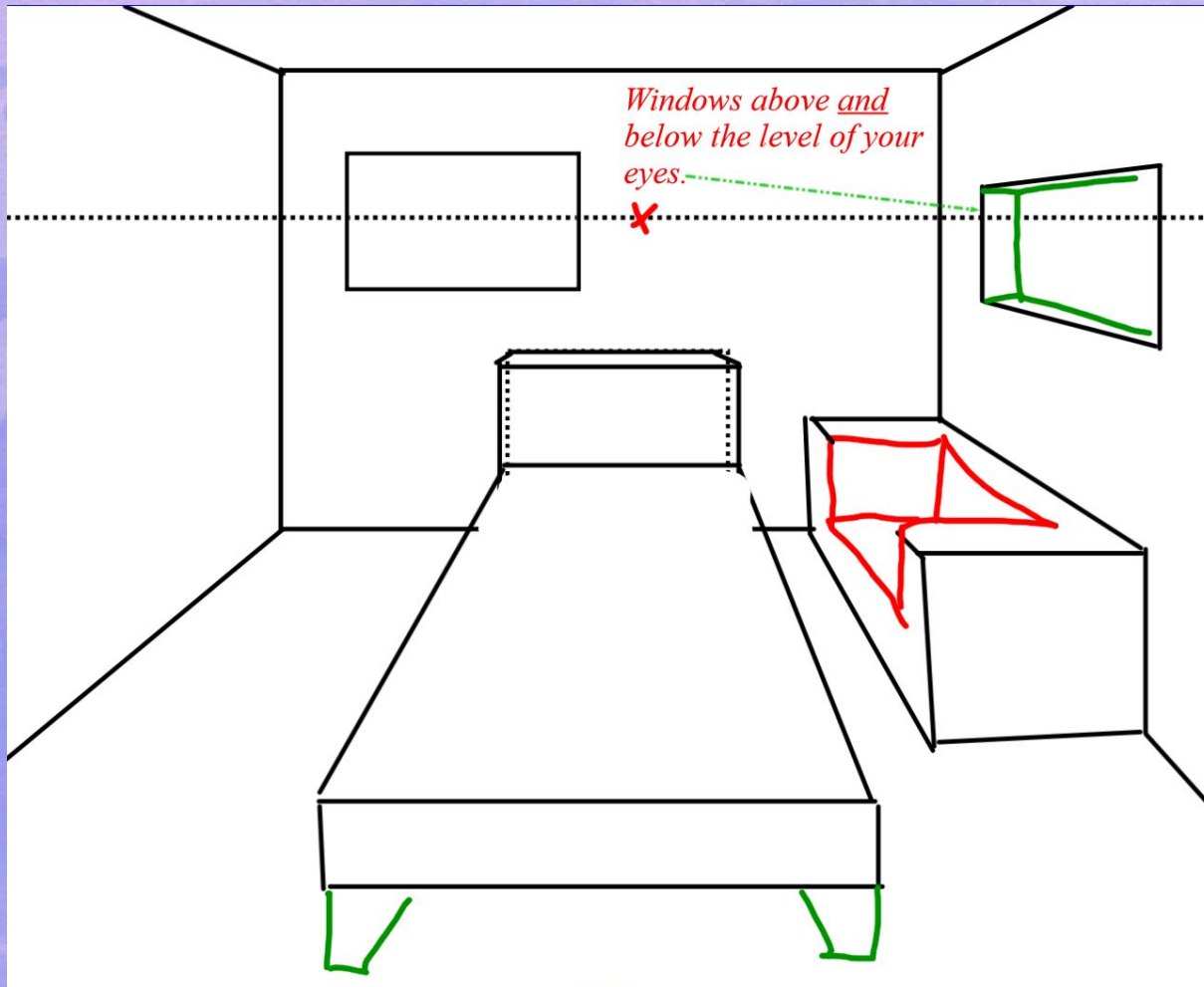


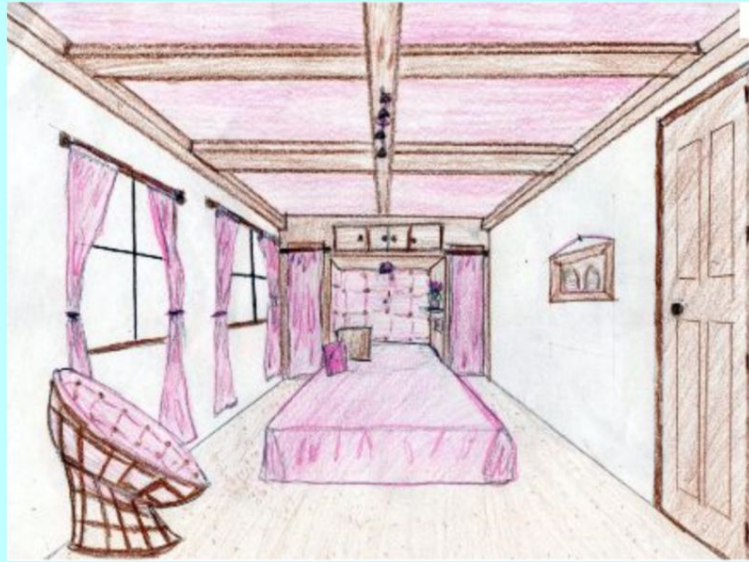
Add furniture by starting with a "box" in the correct position, then "cut out" the empty spaces.







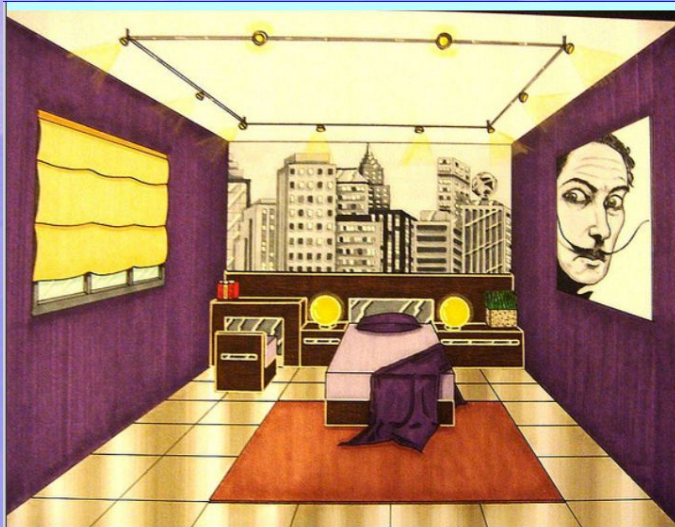
