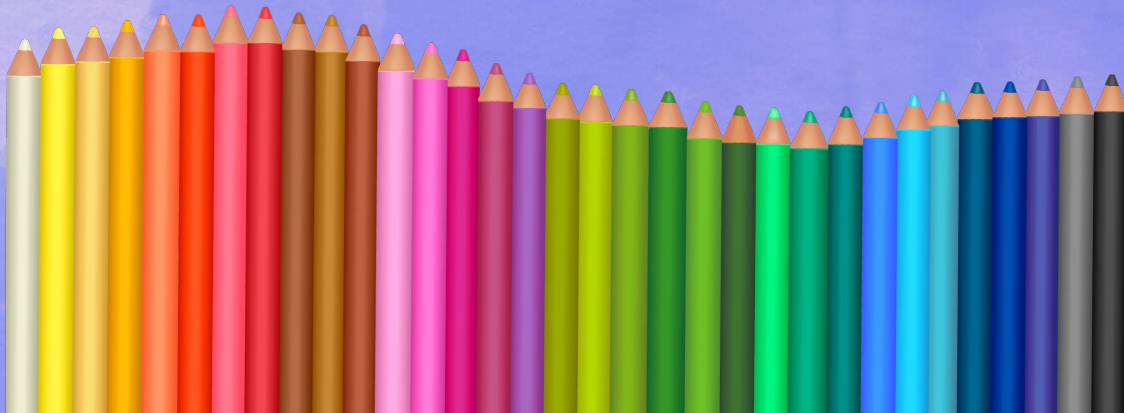
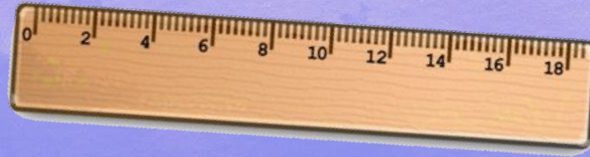
I hope you are all doing well. I have received fantastic work from many of you. Well done!

- Quality Drawing paper (Blank paper is fine)



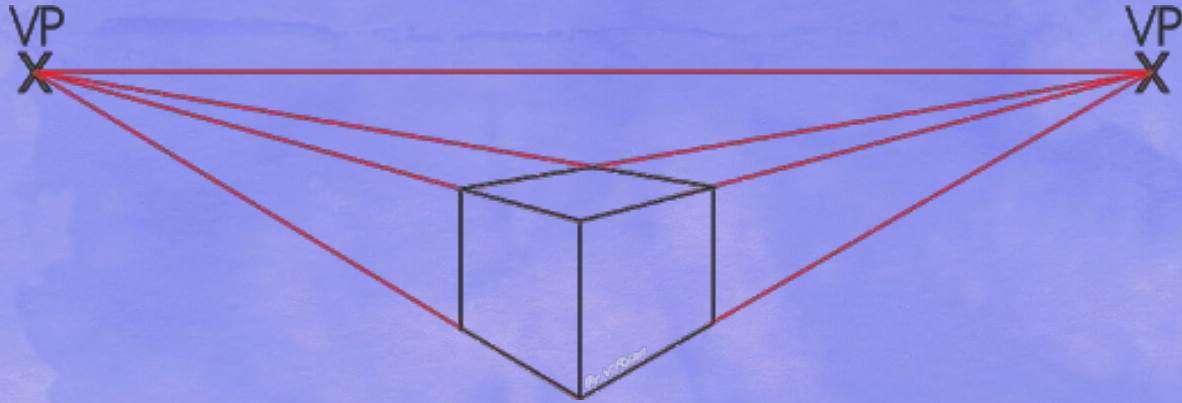
Project Overview

- ❑ Students will create a two-point perspective drawing to create the illusion of depth and space in their drawing. Students will draw a room (bedroom, kitchen, bathroom, etc.)



What is Two-Point Perspective?

- A linear perspective in which parallel lines along the width and depth of an object are represented as meeting at two separate points on the horizon that are 90 degrees apart as measured from the common intersection of the lines of projection.
